Governance

We have distributed a discussion paper developed by John Ramsay & Associates to all stakeholders on the database for comment before the report is finalised by the end of March.

Service model

We have received the final service model report from BurnsBridge Sweett. Because the report is long, we are developing a synopsis and will make this available for broader distribution and feedback over the coming weeks.

Architects and user group workshops

Forward Brianese (architects) held its first workshop with project user group representatives in late February to better understand each service area's design needs for the Clarence ICC/GP Super Clinic.

The second user group workshop was held on Friday March 6.

In the morning session, Forward Brianese presented a summary of the information gained from the user groups so far and brainstormed the functional layout of services in the new building and how they interrelate with each other.

The afternoon session further explored the specific needs for each user group.

The user group and architects will continue to meet fortnightly. The architects will use the information from these meetings to help them develop the first phase schematic design, due for completion by April 2009.
