Summary

The aim of the Mulching Munchkins program is to develop a comprehensive yet flexible agricultural program designed for primary school aged children. The Mulching Munchkins program will link with the history, science, literacy and numeracy Australian Curriculum requirements.

Mulching Munchkins will connect children and their families' of Bridport and Ringarooma Primary schools to their local food system from the paddock to the plate.

Practical activities relating to soil preparation, mulching, composting, planting, farm maintenance, animal husbandry, food processing, transport and preparation will be combined with the teaching curriculum. This will allow learning to be engaging and set against the local back drop of the rural community in which the children live.

It will expose children to a range of career options with in the food and agriculture sectors.

Benefits and achievements

Bridport and Ringarooma Primary School teaching staff are working with their children on the school gardens and curriculum activities which have included:

- Assisting with building and installing garden infrastructure water tanks, hot houses, compost bins, raised garden beds and fencing.
- Mulching Munchkins logo design for each school by the students.
- Classroom science experiments.
- Farm and supermarket visits and cooking with a focus on locally grown produce.
- Student have showcased their understanding of agriculture and food production to peers and wider community
- Visits to the school by agronomists, soil experts and historians.





Challenges

Ensuring the program fits within the National Curriculum Frame work for Australian school students in the areas of science, history, literacy and numeracy as well as health and wellbeing.

If we can embed agricultural learning in the curriculum we can help ensure it becomes integral to teacher lesson planning

Building ongoing partnerships that can be sustained beyond the life of the program.

Promotion

The Mulching Munchkins program is promoted through the Bridport and Ringarooma School Community Networks including their school newsletters.

Media opportunities including use of social media will be used to develop new networks and increase communication around the program.

Opportunities will be sort with program partners from the Education, Agricultural and Health sectors to showcase and share the learning's of the program.

Mulching Munchkins was funded through a Food for All Tasmanians Fund Grant 2012.
